

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


Map showing the claims at the top of Salt Lake's Cottonwood Canyons with bands of limestone, shale, and quartzite identified. Silver Lake or 'Brightons' is located.

Although silver was first discovered in Little Cottonwood Canyon in 1864, major mining in the canyon did not begin until 1868 with the discovery of rich ore at the Emma mine, located north of Alta. Soon after, prospectors headed north over the ridge, into Big Cottonwood. Mining in the Cottonwood Canyons produced mostly silver and lead, with some minor quantities of copper, gold, and zinc. Alta, the largest mining town in Little Cottonwood Canyon, flourished in the late nineteenth century and counted thousands as residents and claimed 26 saloons, seven restaurants, two drug stores, and a variety of other businesses.





Internal pages feature a double-page pictorial map titled 'Northern Arizona Welcomes You.' Jerome is now known as an artist community, but at the turn of the 20th century it was a booming mining town, that had the 'Copper King,' William Andrews Clark as a major investor.





Bird's-eye view looking up canyon. Bingham Canyon, located southwest of Salt Lake City, was first settled in August 1848 by two Mormon pioneers, Thomas and Sanford Bingham. It was used for herding cattle, cutting timber, and later became famous for ore development, primarily by the Utah Copper Company.





Early Bryce Canyon promotional item from the D&RG for the prospective tourist. Illustrated with black and white views and a full-page map. Bryce Canyon was made a National Park by an act of Congress in 1928, and is known the world over for its red rock hoodoos and exceptional hikes (Fairyland, Wall Street, Navajo Loop, Queen's Road, etc.). The park's main road leads past the expansive Bryce Amphitheater, a hoodoo filled wonderland.





Legend at upper left with the major roads listed as: Banff Grand Canyon Road, Evergreen National Highway, Lincoln Highway, National Roosevelt, Navajo Trail, Old Oregon Trail, Pikes Peak Highway, Victory Highway, and the Zion Park Highway. We locate no institutional holdings for this map and no sales histories. Rare.

If not the most widely read book on California, this title certainly would rank high on any list. Dana sailed up and down the California coast in 1835 and 1836. Cover illustration by John Held, Jr. for the sheet music of the Metro Goldwyn Mayer movie of the same name. John Held, Jr. (1889-1958) was one of the most famous illustrators of the 1920s, who is well known for his cartoons depicting the lifestyle and culture of the 'Roaring Twenties' and his long professional relationship with F. Scott Fitgerald, who he illustrated many of the author's books. Held is also credited with popularizing the image of the 'Flapper Girl.' Held was a Utah native whose earliest illustrations were published at the age of 15.






This collection of original illustrations was created by Navajo/Dine artist, Ernest Franklin, for the Ernest Bulow authored work on Navajo Taboos.

Ernest Franklin (1942-2010) was a prize-winning artist who began drawing in early childhood. Franklin is most widely known for his illustrations of Tony Hillerman's Leaphorn & Chee Series. He worked in variety of mediums, including traditional Navajo silversmithing, rawhide braiding and leather carving, both welded and cast sculpture, ceramic pieces, pencil, oil, conte crayon and pen and ink, but it is his vibrant watercolors of cowboy scenes that were his personal favorites. He called himself an Indian Cowboy Artist.





Fred Harvey produced booklet for the prospective tourist to the South Rim of the Big Ditch. Includes descriptions of proposed trips and lodging suggestions with rates. Illustrated with black and white views, including a nice double-page panorama at the center 'Grand Canyon from El Tovar Hotel.' In 1905 Fred Harvey opened the doors to the now legendary El Tovar Hotel, on the edge South Rim of the Grand Canyon. This opulent and faux rustic resort offered visitors an opportunity to view the natural wonder of the Grand Canyon while living in the lap of luxury.







This is the larger version of this poster. Albert Herter (1871-1950) was an American painter, illustrator, muralist, and interior designer. He was born in New York City, studied at the Art Students League with James Carroll Beckwith, then in Paris with Jean-Paul Laurens and Fernand Cormon, Later Herter moved to Chicago, teaching at the Art Institute.





This work consists of ten captioned photogravures printed by the Albertype Company of Brooklyn of the views one might see when taking the cog train to the summit of Pike's Peak. Completed in 1891 (and still in operation) is the world's highest and the world's longest cog railroad, the highest railroad in the United States and the entire Northern Hemisphere, in fact. We locate no institutional holdings. Rare.





Short work that reprints the speeches and talks by the female presenters at a pro-polygamy rally in the Salt Lake Theatre on March 6, 1886. Talks and discourses from M. Isabella Horne, Prescindia L. Kimball, Hannah Tapfield King, Romania B. Pratt, Jennie Tanner, Helen Mar Whitney, Mary Ann Pratt, Zina Y. Williams, Eliza R. Snow, and many others. At this meeting there was the formal adoption of nine resolutions. Among other things, the resolutions objected to the proposed repeal of Utah women's right to vote under the Edmunds-Tucker Bill, the prosecution of anti polygamy laws in the district courts, and the compelling of wives to testify against their husbands. The ninth resolution called upon the women of the United States to "come to our help in resisting these encroachments upon our liberties and these outrages upon our peaceful homes and family relations." This sketch contains an account of the early years of W.B. Ide, recollections by his daughter of the family's trip across the plains to California in 1845, and an account of the Bear Flag revolt of 1846 as told by Ide to his brother in 1849, and in a letter to a Senator Wambough which, as Ide died in 1852, must have been written within a few years of the event. This work is also important in that it is one of the few overland journals written from the point of view of a woman, and is unique in its exclusive treatment of the Bear Flag Revolt. William Ide was leader of the Bear Flag movement of Sonoma, and has been referred to as the 'President' of California. Cowan II p.118. Eberstadt 105: 136. Graff 2059. Howes I4. Mintz 250. 





William Patrick Kinsella (1935-2016) began writing at a young age, winning a YMCA contest at age fourteen. Kinsella received his BA from University of Victoria in 1974, before obtaining a master of fine arts in English through the Iowa Writers' Workshop (1978). Before becoming a professional author, he was a professor of English at the University of Calgary. Kinsella's most famous work 'Shoeless Joe' was the basis for the classic movie, 'Field of Dreams.'







The result of their labor is here - and, what's more, We'll remark that in Utah they laugh at all four.' This image appears on page 49 of 'The Mormon Graphic Image' Puck was the first successful humor magazine in the United States of colorful cartoons, caricatures, and political satire of the issues of the day.

This image was part of the national sentiment at the time (not in Utah) that was celebrating the signing of the antipolygamy Edmunds Act by President Chester A. Arthur. This image appears on page 48 of 'The Mormon Graphic Image' Puck was the first successful humor magazine in the United States of colorful cartoons, caricatures and political satire of the issues of the day.




Newsletters from the New England Mission that contain news from the Mission, comings and goings, comics and other miscellany. Included with this collection are 90 pages of mimeographed 'Comparative Reports' covering the same time period for the Western and Northern Massachusetts districts.

The New England Mission was organized in September 1937 from portions of the Eastern States Mission and the Canadian Mission. It was composed of the states of Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Maine, Vermont, and New Hampshire. As well as the Canadian provinces Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland.

This thoroughly researched examination into occult traditions surrounding Smith, his family, and other founding Mormons cannot be understated. Among the practices no longer a part of Mormonism is the use of divining rods for revelation, astrology to determine the best times to conceive children and plant crops, the study of skull contours to understand personality traits, magic formulae utilized to discover lost property, and the wearing of protective talismans. Ninety-four photographs and illustrations accompany the text.

Nice view of the Brooks Arcade building at the corner of 3rd south and State in Salt Lake City. Signage for Shepherd the Magazine Man, Nelson Glove, C.H. Gibbs Mining Engineer, and Hemenway & Moser Cigar Store are visible.

Like other Utah commercial buildings of the time period, the Brooks Arcade is an example of Richardsonian Romanesque architecture, a style which became popular in the state's commercial buildings erected during the building boom of 1889-1893. Intended to be six stories high, the building apparently began to sink under the weight of its brick and stone superstructure and only three stories were completed.



Birger Sandzen (1871-1954) was a Swedish born, American artist, who is renowned for his landscape paintings and prints.





"Built on a dreary hill, surrounded by threatening mountains and buffeted by fierce snowstorms, Leadville is an ominous place, stark and cold. But




hidden beneath the grime and bilious paint encrusted on the buildings like a patina are the remains of the wildest, gaudiest, most raucous mining camp in Colorado, the most glamorous, glittering silver town in the West. From the time silver was discovered in Leadville in 1875 until the collapse of the silver market in 1893, Leadville fascinated the world with its instant millionaires and villainous ways. It was known as both the wickedest city in the world and the most progressive mining town in Christendom." - p.118 'Colorado Ghost Towns and Mining Camps.'

Theodore Schroeder (1864-1953) was a lawyer and a specialist in evolutionary psychology, who was a prolific writer. After obtaining a law degree from the University of Wisconsin, he relocated to Salt Lake City, to help the Mormons, who he believed were being unfairly punished by the Federal Government. While in Utah he helped to organize the first Democratic Club of Utah and the reorganization of the Salt Lake Herald. He also helped in the effort to gain statehood for Utah and he was also involved in the founding of the First Unitarian Society. He soon became disillusioned with the Mormons and Mormonism. He founded Lucifer's Lantern, a journal in which he outlined his view that Mormonism derived from sexual sources. Schroder was instrumental in the fight against the seating of B.H. Roberts in the U.S. Congress. Issues of Lucifer's Lantern are rare. Flake/Draper 5010.

Produced for the Utah Council of Teachers of English, Utah Endowment for the Humanities, and Utah State University. Printed by Herald Printing. A very cool thing. "Literary Utah reflects a surprising diversity and number of poets, dramatists, novelists, and essayist. The terrain includes writers who were born in the state, raised here, or set their work here."



Rare price list produced for the Logan, Utah, Zions Cooperative Mercantile Institution, known as Z.C.M.I., or the 'People's Store,' is what one historian called America's first department store. Founded in 1868 by Brigham Young to combat the inevitable change that the railroad and outsiders would bring to his Great Basin Kingdom. Although never truly a cooperative, it was hugely successful for 125 plus years and a retail giant in the Interior West.

The text from the front wrapper: 'Le Livre de Mormon. Histoire Sacree des Peuple Aborigenes de L'Amerique Publie par John Taylor' ['The Book of Mormon. Sacred History of the Aboriginal People of America Published by John Taylor']. This is the first time that we've encountered or handled a copy of this title in original wrappers. Exceedingly rare.

The true first edition, with the required street address in the publication information at bottom of title page reading: "Rue de Paradis-Poissonnière." Translated primarily by Curtis Bolton from July 1850 to January 1852. Contrary to the information on the title page John Taylor knew practically no French and performed no translation on the book. Corrections of grammar and revision were commenced in 1851 with the help of a Brother Wilhelm. Wilhelm left the Church in March 1851, so non-member Lazare Auge assisted Bolton with the final revision. It was printed by Marc Ducloux of Paris from January 13 to January 22, 1852. 1,000 copies printed. Flake/Draper 715. Jacobs 136B. Sabin 83122. Crawley 656.SS



'A Bitter Message.' is the only SRL 'show' shot as a film with a story line. The two Lynch shorts are his first two student films (the second made with an AFI grant). This one-off film festival screened at Salt Lake City's Cinema in Your Face! from May 12th to the 18th in 1988. Cinema in Your Face was Salt Lake's independent arthouse that closed when the owners acquired 9th and 9th's Tower Theatre.



Don C. Talayesva (1890–1985) was born and raised in the Hopi village of Old Oraibi until the age of ten. He then spent nearly ten years training at white government schools. At the age of twenty, Talayesva returned to Hopiland and readopted Hopi tribal customs. Leo W. Simmons was a Yale anthropologist who recorded Talayesva's autobiography.

Ernie Bulow (1943-2021) was a sometime bookman whose interests and experiences extended to journalism, photography, Indian trading, writing, silversmithing, and teaching. After taking a degree in English in the early sixties he worked for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, living in Gallup and teaching English at Fort Wingate on the Navajo


Reservation. Following receipt of a doctorate from the University of Utah, he returned to New Mexico, where he traded in Indian jewelry and Kachinas and opened a bookstore, among other activities.





Earth First! was an environmental group founded by Dave Foreman, Ron Kezar, Mike Roselle, Howie Wolke, and Bart Koehler in 1980 as an alternative to more mainstream groups such as the Sierra Club and the Wilderness Society. EF! describes itself as "pure, hard-line, radical," and advocates supplementing lobbying practices with more direct tactics such as "demonstrations" and "confrontations." In addition to supporting traditional conservation, EF! calls for the re-creation of wilderness through the construction of a national system of ecological preserves in which dams, roads, and other traces of human activity will be removed. "No Compromise in Defense of Mother Earth." Rare.
